AEA's Mission

The American Economic Association (AEA) has been encouraging economic research since its inception in 1885 at a gathering in Saratoga Springs, New York. It now publishes a collection of the most respected journals in economics.

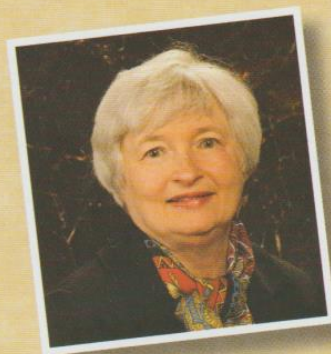
The AEA's mission is to (1) encourage economic research, especially the historical and statistical study of the actual conditions of economic life; (2) issue publications on economic subjects; and (3) encourage perfect freedom of discussion about economics, taking no partisan attitude or committing its members to any position on practical economic questions. To foster these goals, the Association publishes seven professional economics journals—36 issues annually—and organizes an annual conference where more than 3,000 economists have an opportunity to present their research.



Amy Finkelstein (2012) and Raj Chetty (2013) are two recent recipients of the John Bates Clark Medal awarded annually to an outstanding economist under the age of 40.

Association Members

The Association comprises more than 20,000 members representing a range of interests and cultures from around the world. Most hold a PhD in economics. Many are or have been important leaders in government, industry, and academe. About 60 percent are college and university teachers who are passionate about the value that an understanding of economic concepts can provide for public policy, as well as for the personal lives of their students. All members share a common interest in making a difference through their contributions in economics.



Many AEA leaders move into influential and responsible roles in government and industry as evidenced by former AEA Executive Committee member Janet Yellen's appointment as Chair of the Federal Reserve Board.

Honors and Awards

Each year the Association awards the prestigious John Bates Clark Medal to an economist under the age of 40 who is judged to have made the most significant contribution to economic knowledge. The Association also recognizes four North American economists as Distinguished Fellows annually and maintains a continuing roster of 40 Foreign Honorary Members. Many Association members play pivotal roles on the Executive Committee and other committees, and as journal editors and peer reviewers, where they contribute to the work of the Association.

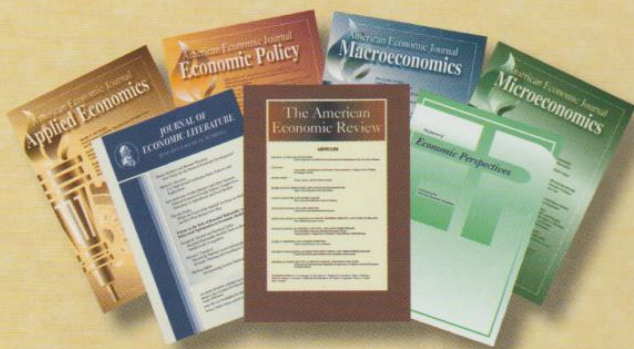

The annual announcement of the John Bates Clark Medal winner is eagerly anticipated by the media and the economics community.

Leading Publications

The AEA publishes a set of the most prestigious economics journals in the world, disseminating cutting-edge research results. The *American Economic Review* (AER) was first published in 1911 and continues as one of the most cited and respected journals in economics. Over the years, key economics ideas like the role of firms in the economy, the Cobb-Douglas production function, rent-seeking, the Kuznets Curve, and the effect of capital structure on a firm's value (the Modigliani-Miller Theorem) first emerged in the AER. Notable twentieth century economists such as James Buchanan, Irving Fisher, Milton Friedman, Paul Samuelson, George Stigler, and James Tobin all published their research in the AER at least a dozen times each.



AEA journals offer authors a forum for sharing their research and collaborating with peers on complex issues.

The Association's journals include the AER, the *Journal of Economic Literature* (JEL), the *Journal of Economic Perspectives* (JEP), and the four field-specific *American Economic Journals: Applied, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, and Policy* (AEJs). The AER and the AEJs are refereed by experts who hold the submitted research to the highest level of scrutiny and academic integrity. The JEL contains survey and review articles, listings of new books, and book reviews. The JEP, which is free to the public, publishes less technical articles that report on and critique recent research findings, evaluate public policy initiatives, and serve as insightful readings for classroom use. All of the Association's journals are mainstays in university libraries and economics departments, where they inspire future research and stimulate thoughtful discussions that improve our understanding of economics.

Knowledge Steward

The AEA plays an important role as steward of the ever-growing body of research published by economists. *EconLit* is a comprehensive, searchable bibliographic database of the world's economics publications, including working papers from leading universities that describe research in progress, peer-reviewed journal articles, PhD dissertations, and books. *EconLit* is continuously updated and now contains more than 1.4 million entries from 74 countries with coverage as far back as 1886. Leading universities and research institutions subscribe to *EconLit* because it is a valuable resource for both economics scholars and students.

The "JEL Codes" classification system originated with the *Journal of Economic Literature* in the 1960s. It is the standard method of classifying and retrieving scholarly literature in economics, as well as being used for indicating fields of interest by employers in job listings for economists, and for organizing the Association's annual conference. Classifiers regularly update the system based on shifts in subjects of economic research.

Meetings and Conferences

The annual January AEA Meeting brings together more than 13,000 economists to present and critique research, exchange ideas, network with colleagues, and participate in the job market. More than 500 research sessions are held during the three-day event. It is the largest annual gathering of economists in the world, and is held in conjunction with 55 other specialized associations of economists. The annual Ely Lecture and the Presidential Address are the featured presentations. Papers from about 30 of the sessions are subsequently published in the May *AER Papers & Proceedings*.

A Continuing Education Conference immediately follows the annual convention, where experts on three topics bring mid-career researchers up to date with 12 hours of lectures on each.

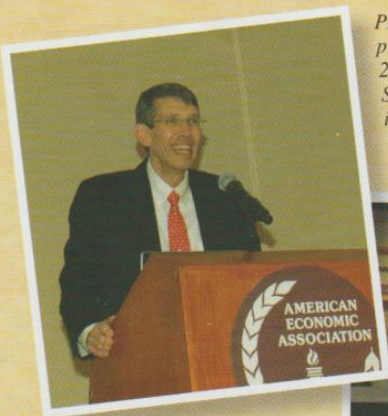
Each May, the Association organizes a conference focused on teaching economics. It includes plenary talks by leading research economists who are also particularly interested in teaching, sessions presenting research about teaching economics more effectively, and practical workshops. Each year the event engages about 300 economists whose primary work responsibility is teaching.

Career Enhancement

Helping economists find a good employment fit is essential to maximizing their research potential. The core of the Association's job market services is the *JOE Network*. Its *Job Openings for Economists* listing service posted more than 2,400 new academic vacancies and nearly 850 non-academic positions for economists in the United States and abroad in 2015.

The *JOE Network* allows job candidates to create a profile that prospective employers can search, and automates job applications. Employers manage applications, securely collect reference letters, and download applicant data. Faculty can upload letters and automate their responses to reference requests.

The AEA's job market services reach a high point at the January Annual Meeting, which also serves as the profession's job fair and site for conducting first-round live interviews. The Association offers a signaling service that allows job seekers to indicate special interest in up to two employers in early December, and a job "scramble" in March that helps match job candidates still available with positions that also remain vacant.

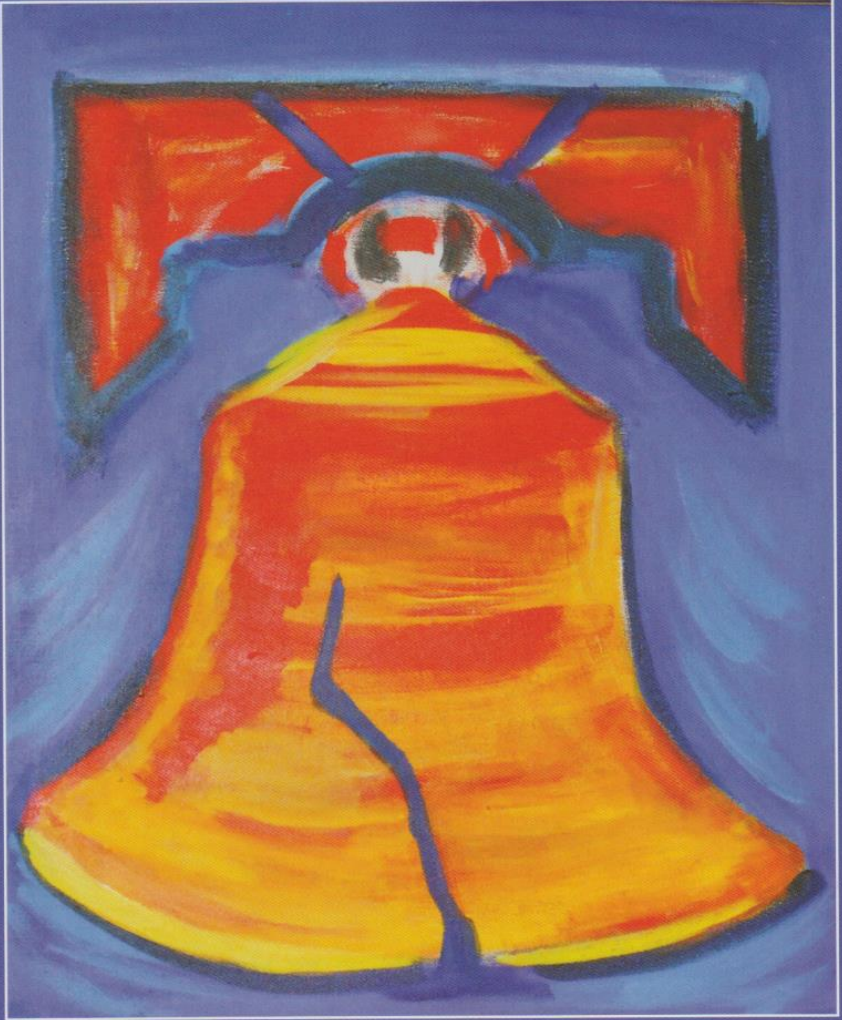

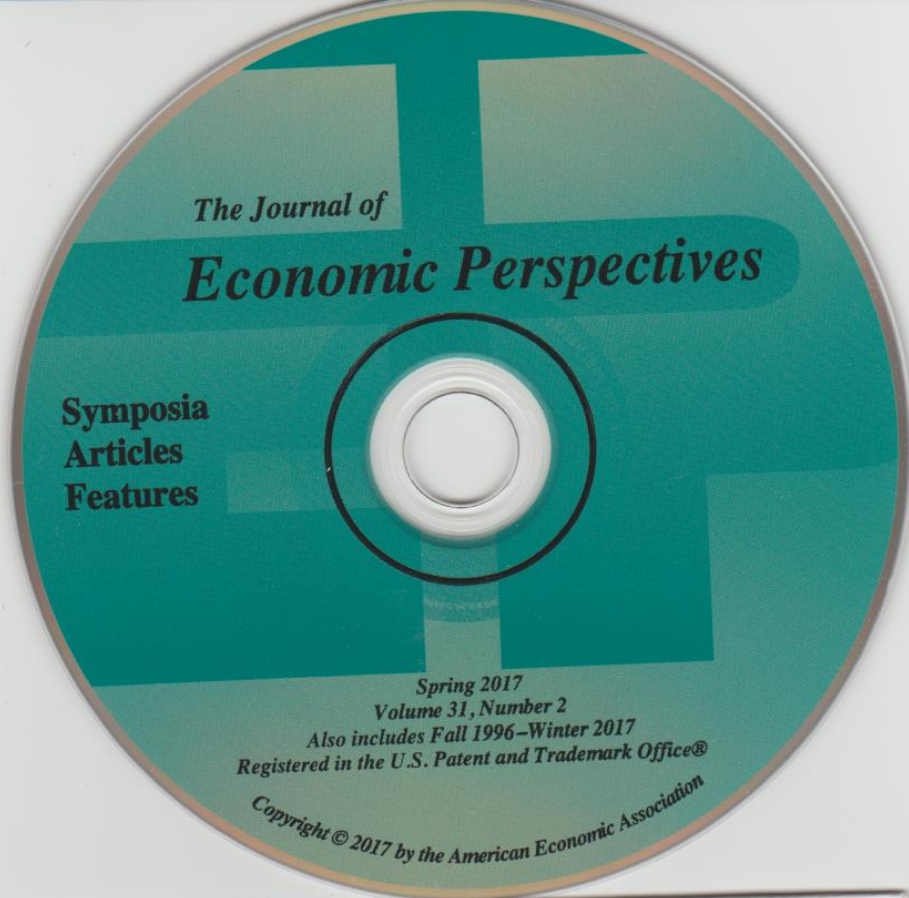
